Q 1. What is the Purpose of the Ministry:

Kin Ministry is used to connect caring members of our church with adults who are partially or completely homebound. A Kin Minister seeks to connect with these individuals at least once a month to offer Christian encouragement, friendship and support. Connection may take place through a home visits, phone call or a variety of other methods. Q 6. What Training Does the Church Offer to Volunteers?

Formal training, through BeFriender Ministry, will be given to all ministry volunteers. In addition to the training, each volunteer must complete an informal interview with a member of the Pastoral Staff to ensure an understanding of what is entailed as well as a background screening required of all volunteers who have contact with vulnerable persons.

Q 8. What is a Kin Leader?

Kin leaders generally pastors or church staff and are assigned by a congregation to run Kin Ministry within their church.

Q 9. How Does the Church match Kin to volunteers?

Each parishioner requesting a visit from a minister will be matched with a minister who has similar hobbies, likes, personalities, etc. to ensure the pairing will result in a meaningful and mutual pairing.
